## **GROUND FLOOR**

### **The Main Hall**

The oak panelled hall is 14 metres long by 9 metres wide. Head clearance under the stage lights is 3 metres.

The seated audience capacity is 100 subject to the stage layout, and for a meal 120. There are 28 tables available and 150 chairs.

Four portable stage sections 1.8 x 2.4m, giving a stage of 3.6 x 4.8m. The dual height staging can be used for elevated audience seating. Two stage lighting bars hold a total of 12 spot/flood lights.

There is a portable hearing loop, and a regularly serviced piano.

Full central heating.

### **The Bar**

Situated at the end of the hall, a full licensed wet bar with draught beers, wine and spirits is available, plus a large screen television.

### **The Library**

With a seating capacity of 25, this room is ideal for club meetings, interviews and private conferences. A drop down screen and hearing loop are fitted.

### **The Kitchen**

At the opposite end of the Main Hall from the Bar is a fully equipped kitchen with a five ring induction hob and two large ovens, two microwave ovens, and a hot cabinet. There are tools, cutlery and crockery to serve 120 covers.

There is a double stainless steel sink with endless hot water along with a large dishwasher.

Environmental Health regularly inspect, and the Kitchen and Bar both have a 5 rating.

## **FIRST FLOOR**

### **The Girls' Parlour**

This unique characterful room has a number of comfortable seating areas and a collection of antique chairs.

There is a seating capacity of 35, a drop down screen for presentations, and a regularly serviced piano.

The unisex toilet is accessed from the landing. There is a small kitchenette with tea-making facilities between the Girls' Parlour and the Snooker Room.

Disabled access is via the portable ramp into the downstairs lobby, and a stair lift to the first floor.

### **The Snooker Room**

With a full size snooker table and all the equipment required, this increasingly rare facility has seen many village championships and corporate bonding events.

### **Users of the Hall**

include the W.I., Dyfed-Powys Police, Llandinam Drama Group, Llandinam Art Club, Tuesday Lunch Club, Tai Chi Club, Keep Fit Club, Sports Club, Llandinam Local History Group, Sewing Club, Quiz Night, Christmas Dinner for 120, New Year's Eve party, Six Nations Rugby on the large screen.

In addition there are plays, concerts, ceilidhs, coffee mornings and local history fairs. Also private parties with bouncy castles, and parties for small children in the Girls' Parlour.
